A NOTE FROM HEATHER



To Our Community, Partners, and Supporter,

It is with great pleasure that I share our latest Impact Report for 2023. This report encapsulates the remarkable achievements, progress, and transformative outcomes that have been made possible through the dedicated efforts of our team, partners, supporters, and the communities we serve.

2023 was a year of incredible growth and development for The Thrive Networks. After the transition of the original founder, Taj Stokes, in 2022, our focus shifted to one of sustainability and longevity. This Impact Report serves as a testament to the meaningful strides we've taken toward curriculum development for program stability, increased engagement, and a more diverse funding portfolio.

Understanding the importance of both community and connections, we engaged with several community leaders that felt passionate about entrepreneurship and giving back. We now engage with over 30 individuals as guest facilitators, mentors, or volunteers.

We also made sure to collaborate with other partners in this ecosystem to give introductions, introduce resources, and in some instances sign up for services so they continue to get support after the program.

When I transitioned into the position of Executive Director later in the year, I focused on diversifying funding, creating sponsorship opportunities, holding our first 2 fundraisers, and educating anyone who would listen on the importance of Thrive in our community.

We also changed the culture of the organization to continue to support and engage with entrepreneurs after graduation. This included implementing a mentorship program and creating an Alumni Committee to create future events and opportunities for engagement.

As the program really excelled, our number of applicants were more than double of the number of participants we accepted, so we raised our class size from 15 to 25 participants.

We watched several Alumni open or expand their business this year and are excited to share some of those stories with you in this report. These narratives exemplify the spirit of resilience, determination, and hope that define our mission and inspire us to continue our pursuit of changing underserved communities from within.

And finally, we secured our first classroom space! We are now located in the Family Success Center which provides free childcare (from one of our Alumni) while the participants are in class. Just another way we are breaking down barriers!

While we are proud of the work completed in the past year, we remain steadfast on continued development both in operations and curriculum designed to be taught in Spanish. So here is to 2024!

My gratitude to the staff and board for all their hard work, the community partners for their investment in our entrepreneurs, and to the organizations to whom we have received financial support for what we do. Thank you for being an integral part of our journey towards positive change. Together we can continue to make a difference and build a better community for generations to come!



Thrive served as the fiscal sponsor for the inaugural Colorado Springs Fiestas Patrias Celebration (a patriotic holiday in Mexico, the anniversary of Mexican Independence from Spain, much like the American 4th of July). About 43,000 people were in attendance over two days and had an economic impact of \$3.2 million. This event has allowed us to better engage the Hispanic cultures in Southeast Colorado Springs and will help us to promote our upcoming The Thrive Spanish Program.

FAMILY SUCCESS CENTER

We have celebrated moving into the Family Success Center and will begin to host our future classes out of the space and look forward to our entrepreneurs being able to drop their kids off and have time to focus on their businesses.

CONTINUING EDUCATION

We are going to continue to develop our programing and offering secondary programs based on the feedback from out entreprneurs

SPANISH CLASSES

Meet the need of the growing demand for classes in Spanish by having our Curriculum translated into Spanish and creating a team of Spanish speaking experts, mentors, and facilitators.

INFRASTRUCTURE

It is our goal to implement more technology and take time to automate our processes to reduce workload off of the staff and focus that energy on more program development.
