It is with great pleasure that I share with you our Impact Report for 2024. This report encapsulates the achievements, progress, and outcomes that have been made possible through the dedicated efforts of our team, partners, and the communities we serve.

2024 was a year of incredible growth and development for The Thrive Networks. We finalized our curriculum with a 250-page workbook with defined objectives and presentations to go alongside each class. We increased the exposure to partner organizations, city departments, and community leaders who volunteer their time and expertise to teaching our program. We also incorporated the Social Impact curriculum from the Colorado Social Impact Group.

With the development of our new curriculum, the interest in our program soared with more applicants than available seats in our classes! We met that need by increasing our class size from 15 to 25 participants per class. We also incorporated more Alumni training opportunities and one on one support to ensure long term success.

We continued to work with our grant writer at AJS Consulting to diversify our funding sources and had 6 new foundations pledge support to our organization in the past year alone, including support from El Paso County and the City of Colorado Springs! We also received special funding from DOLA to improve the infrastructure of our organization, utilizing the funds to build a new website, incorporate automations, and translation of our curriculum to Spanish.

We hosted our first Spanish Language Cohort with 16 participants! These businesses worked hard to learn some important business skills and develop a business plan for the first time! They then graduated at Fiestas Patrias, a festival held in Downtown Colorado Springs. I could not have been more proud of them as they stood on stage sharing their stories!

With over 200 graduates, we have even more stories to share with you this year from recent graduates in the pages that follow. These stories exemplify the spirit of resilience, determination, and hope that define our mission and inspire us to continue our pursuit of changing underserved communities from within.

Our Board of Directors continues to work diligently on creating exceptional board governance and a strategic plan for long term sustainability of our organization! Plans for the upcoming year include development of a personal development program, case management services, career certification programs, and an accelerator program. I look forward to working hard to achieve the goals set forth by the Board and appreciate the expertise, support, and volunteerism that I experience with such a dedicated Board of Directors.

And finally, our mighty staff of two worked hard on professional and organizational development, hitting many of the milestones we set this year. I am proud to serve alongside Andi Propst, our Operations Coordinator, and an incredible Board of Directors who truly care about the community we serve and the impact we create. My gratitude to all the other individuals and organizations that support us as well. Thank you for being an integral part of our journey towards positive change. Together we can continue to make a difference and build a better community for generations to come!

## 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

### Mayor announces state grants supporting Colorado Springs small businesses



Of the 12 businesses awarded, six were Thrive alumni, a testament to the strength and resilience of our program graduates. By managing this grant, we are directly investing in the success of small businesses, fostering economic growth, and strengthening our community.

Thrive was awarded a **Community Business** Preservation grant from Office of Economic Development & International Trade, ensuring that 12 small businesses in Colorado Springs received critical funding to overcome challenges and continue growing. As part of our commitment to supporting local entrepreneurs, we not only helped businesses secure these grants but also guided them in using the funds effectively to maximize their impact.

The Thrive Networks awarded \$190,000 to the

Thrive served as the fiscal sponsor for the Colorado Springs Fiestas Patrias Celebration (a patriotic holiday in Mexico, the anniversary of Mexican Independence from Spain, much like the American 4th of July). About 54,000 people were in attendance over two days and had an economic impact of \$8.1 million. This event has allowed us to better engage the Hispanic cultures in Southeast Colorado Springs and will help us to promote our ongoing Spanish Programing.


